we | PLAN Process Framework

MAPP:

Mobilizing for **A**ction through
Planning and **P**artnerships

- a strategic approach to community health improvement.
- community-wide and **community directed** planning
- *developed by NACCHO and CDC*
With a new added NACCHO Health Equity supplement



MAPP: Community Health Assessment (CHA)

The MAPP model employs 4 comprehensive assessments.

Together these drive the identification of local public health system priorities as well as strengths, challenges, opportunities, and threats which will inform the development of the Community Health Improvement Plan (CHIP)

- **The Local Public Health System Assessment** measures the capacity of the local public health system to conduct the 10 essential public health services.
- **The Forces of Change Assessment** identifies forces that are occurring or will occur that will affect the community or the local public health system.
- **The Community Themes and Strengths Assessment** identifies themes that interest and engage the community, perceptions about quality of life, and community assets.
- **The Community Health Status Assessment** analyzes data about health status, quality of life, and risk factors in the community.

we | PLAN and PHAB Accreditation/IDPH Certification

Required for PHAB accreditation and Local Health Department (LHD) Certification by IL Dept of Public Health (IDPH).

- Necessary for eligibility for Local Health Protection (Environmental Health/ Communicable Disease Control) grant funds
- Impacts eligibility for other state, federal “pass-through” and federal grant funds



WePLAN 2015 Health Priorities

1. Chronic Disease, focusing on cardiovascular disease prevention;
2. Violence Prevention, focusing on reducing youth violence;
3. Improve Sexual Health Status of Youth, focusing on reducing youth sexually transmitted infections and teen pregnancy;
4. Access to Healthcare Services, focusing on increasing access to primary care.

Impact *we* | PLAN 2015

WePLAN 2015 became a vision document aligned with the health department's Strategic Plan

Within CCDPH, staff resources were aligned with all 4 priorities and a federal grant was received to expand 1 priority

Secured nearly \$25 million to implement and evaluate policy, systems or environmental (PSE) changes that promote healthy eating, active living, tobacco-free living or clinical linkages to community resources that support chronic disease prevention or management.

Impact *we* | PLAN 2015

Ensured data collection, reports and social media expansion that include:

- Assessment of Corner Stores in Suburban Cook County, Illinois
- Developed a CCDPH STI microsite on the website
- Web-based interactive service Resource Directory with listings of adolescent-friendly STI treatment providers
- Development and promotion of Bullying Prevention Toolkit
- Executed communication campaigns, including Tobacco Cessation; Rethink Your Drink; That's Just Nasty; and Healthy HotSpot campaigns

Impact of *we*PLAN 2015

Increased community department collaboration was evident in all priorities

- Cultivated relationships with County sister agencies and built alliances leading to leveraging of resources to support the Housing Authority of Cook County in going smoke-free; and the Forest Preserves of Cook County in establishing Gateway Sites
- Promoted the adoption of policy supporting CSHE in school districts where there were high rates of STIs
- Convened the Community Health Advisory Committee (CHAC)

Promote and expand coordination and better integration of activities with community partners
