



ABOUT THE COOK COUNTY HEALTH ATLAS

Cook County Department of Health (CCDPH) is excited to introduce an online Cook County Health Atlas that makes public health data more accessible.

What is the Health Atlas?

The Health Atlas is a searchable database that residents, community organizations, policymakers, researchers, and public health stakeholders can use to access, analyze, and download health data from over 120 municipalities, hundreds of zip codes, and census tracts across suburban Cook County.

How can the Health Atlas be used?

Users can look at more than 100 indicators of health and see them visualized in maps, charts, graphs, and tables. It provides a tool for exploring, identifying, and communicating environmental, neighborhood, and other social determinants of health. This tool can be used for grant writing, to inform program and policy development, and to monitor progress in improving health and advancing health equity.

What data is included in the Health Atlas?

Data spans six broad categories:

- Health Outcomes
- Health Behaviors
- Healthcare
- Demographics
- Socioeconomic Status
- Physical Environment

Data in the Health Atlas is being integrated into a phased approach. Current data includes chronic disease, infectious disease, injury, violence, maternal and child health, substance use, access to care, demographics, socioeconomic, and physical environment indicators. Data shared on the platform are regularly updated.
