


Unraveling Measles: What You Need to Know!

Texas/New Mexico/Oklahoma:

Official count is 321 cases across counties.

- Two deaths: child in TX, adult in NM, both unvaccinated
- Likely substantial underreporting*
- Outbreaks in 10 states so far this year
- No measles cases reported in Suburban Cook County this year




Measles is a highly contagious, serious airborne disease caused by a virus that can lead to severe complications and death.

Spreads through breathing, coughing, or sneezing. It is caused by a virus that lives in the nose and throat mucus of an infected person.

For each sick person, how many subsequent people will be infected?

Measles Exposure

Spread by airborne particles that linger in the air.

Exposure = in a shared airspace or in an airspace that was occupied by the infected person within the prior 2 hours.


Measles is so contagious that if one person has it, up to 90% of the people close to that person who are not immune will also become infected.

and the actual spread will vary under different conditions.












Measles vaccination rates for kindergarteners vary by state

School Exclusions for Measles


Criteria for Exclusion from School

- Exclude for at least 4 days after the start of rash.
- Susceptible contacts: Those who do not receive the vaccine within 72 hours of exposure shall be excluded for 21 days after onset of the last case.





- Remember resources are available





What are P, S, and E?

II SNAP-Fd

Policy: Written rules, codes, or laws that determine the practices of an organization.

Systems: Groups of related practices or related organizations that work together.

Environment: The physical, economic, and social spaces, people interact with.

Examples of PSE Changes In K-12 Schools

Setting	Example
Policy	A school district sets healthy food standards for fund raisers
Systems	A school implements a share table to decrease food waste
Environment	A lunchroom displays posters that encourage healthy food choices



Needs Assessment

- District Level
 - used to assist district level wellness policy and district level wellness initiatives
- School Level
 - used to assess school level nutrition and wellness policies, systems, and environments
 - 3 versions: Elementary, Secondary, and Out of School



Policy & Community Engagement

• Assist the school district in the formation of a wellness committee

II SNAP-Fd

- Provide technical assistance to wellness committees where needed, such as assisting with agendas, plan meetings, and policy guidance specific to USDA and ISBE nutrition and wellness rules
- Provide professional development trainings to school administration and staff on the value and role of school wellness committees
- Assist school districts with the development or update of a comprehensive wellness policy, reviewing the progress of wellness policy goals and comparing to a model wellness policy

Marketing & Environment

Healthy School Campaign - A PSA-based campaign that spreads a message of wellness

Healthy Messages - Toolkits that include posters, flyers, and other forms of signage with a healthy twist

Healthy Lunchroom Makeover - Changes in layout, decor, seasoning stations, and additional healthy eating ideas

Nutrition

- Involving students
- Adding flavor stations
- Boosting reimbursable meals
- Establishing or improving salad bar
- Incorporating farm to school
- Encouraging water consumption
- Conducting tray waste studies
- Coordinating taste tests
- Offering healthy vending
- Making fundraisers healthy
- Celebrating and rewarding students with healthy options



Physical Activity

- Provide training to school staff on brain boosters and in-school physical activity.
 - short opportunities to incorporate movement into the school day so students can be more active.
- Provide staff with training on the benefits of recess before lunch and how to incorporate it into the school's schedule and practices
- Assist in identifying and writing grants related to physical activity or P.E.



Food Access

Backpack Program - Discrete program that packs food into a child's backpack to take home

Share Tables - Prevents food waste and hunger by tabling uneaten foods that can be cleaned

Food Pantries in Schools - A market style pantry

School Gardens - Provides food for cafeteria programs or for a school pantry



Food Access Cont.

Community Eligibility Provision - Allows schools in low-income areas to serve breakfast and lunch at no cost

Breakfast After the Bell - Provides students with low-cost or free breakfast before the start of the school day

Summer Meal Programs - Ensures children in low-income areas receive free meals even when school is not in session



Summer Learning Institutes

Professional development for teachers, school administrators, and school food service professionals

July 29 – school food service professionals

July 31 – teachers and school administrators CEUs available
