Introduction

Cook County Department of Public Health’s Healthy Beginnings Program supports pregnant people, new parents, and babies up to 12 months old living in suburban Cook County by providing free, personalized care before, during, and after pregnancy. Through home visits, education, and connections to community resources, public health nurses help families stay healthy and safe while building a strong foundation for lifelong well-being.

Healthy Beginnings offers one-on-one support tailored to each family’s needs, including guidance for high-risk pregnancies, newborn health assessments, breastfeeding support, safe sleep education, and referrals to essential services such as health insurance, mental health care, housing, and nutrition programs. Partners and community organizations can use this toolkit to raise awareness of available services, encourage referrals, and ensure families know that trusted support is available at no cost to eligible suburban Cook County residents.

At each home visit, our registered public health nurses will:

- provide case management: care coordination and clinical follow-up
- assess your baby's growth and development
- provide nutrition and feeding guidance
- provide perinatal care and education
- provide vaccine education
- promote immunization adherence
- facilitate wraparound access to social services (housing, food, transportation)



Healthy Beginnings: Supporting Suburban Cook County Families Before, During, and After Pregnancy

Pregnancy and the first year of a baby's life can bring joy, questions, and big changes. No family should have to navigate this time alone. Cook County Department of Public Health launched the Healthy Beginnings maternal and child health program to help ensure suburban Cook County families have the care and support needed for a safe pregnancy and a healthy first year of life. The program connects pregnant individuals and their infants with nurses who provide personalized, home-based care beginning early in pregnancy through a baby's first year of life.

Care That Comes to You

Healthy Beginnings connects families with compassionate public health nurses who provide personalized, home-based care starting early in pregnancy and continuing through a baby's first year. Nurses offer guidance on prenatal health, recovery after birth, newborn care, safe sleep, and infant feeding, helping parents feel more confident and prepared.

Support Beyond Health Care

Families often need more than medical care to thrive. Healthy Beginnings helps connect parents to important resources such as nutrition programs, safe housing, transportation, behavioral health services, insurance, and doula support. Nurses also help families manage chronic conditions and keep babies on track with recommended immunizations.

Working Toward Healthier Futures

Many maternal and infant health challenges are preventable. By providing early support, education, and strong connections to care, Healthy Beginnings is helping reduce risks, improve birth outcomes, and give every child the opportunity for a healthy start.

Free and Open to Families

Services are free and available to eligible suburban Cook County residents regardless of income or insurance status. Families can join the program directly or be referred by a health care provider.
